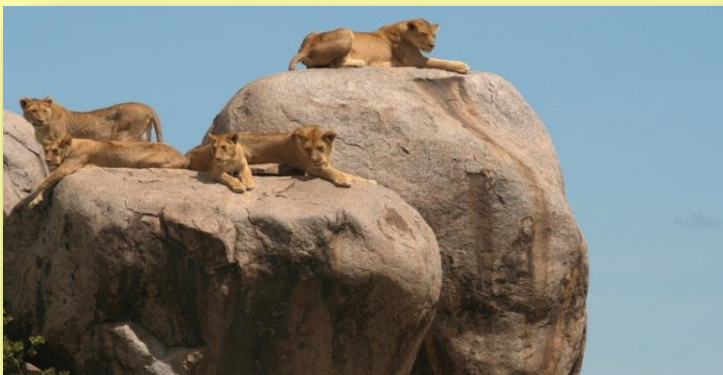
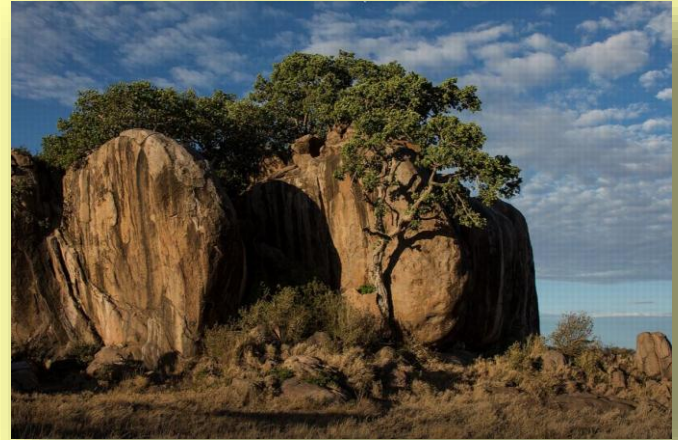


## The Cheetahs of Namiri and Ndotu.

The mesmerizing landscape of Namiri Plains is home to one of the largest concentration of cheetah in East Africa. They rule the golden grasslands of Namiri and weave through its short grass plains to stalk their prey!

The hauntingly beautiful kopjes of Sametu, Barafu and Gol are home to different lion prides who control their territory with aplomb.

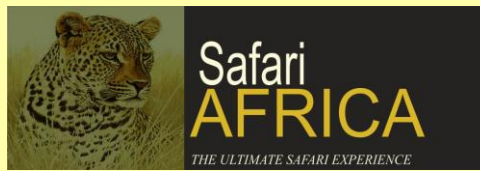


The migration of wildebeest and zebra graze in this area and move through it between November and March, adding an interesting twist to this heady mix of predators!

During our recent visit in January, we literally drove into a wall of wildebeest and zebra which stretched as far as the eye could see! In our first game drive on the plains of Namiri, we were privileged to witness two cheetah brothers attack and take down a young wildebeest in a burst of speed and skill.

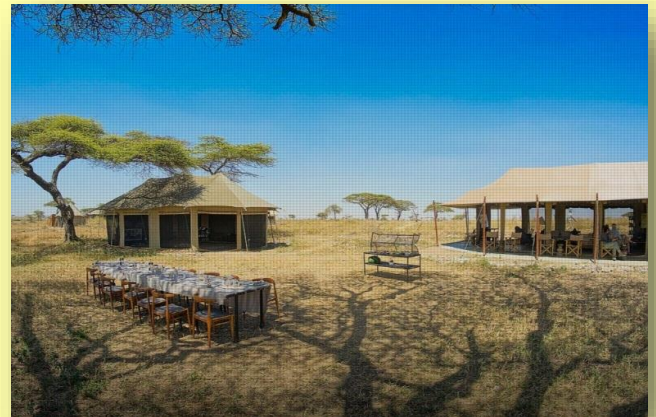


Ndotu is the favorite area for the wildebeest to give birth to their young usually during the month of February. Hundreds of thousands of wildebeest young are born in a short span of 2 to 4 weeks and they remain in Ndotu until the middle of April feeding on its rich and fertile short grass plains.



Ndutu is one of the most famous areas in East Africa to see cheetahs in the open plains stalking their favorite Thomson's or Grant's gazelle.

During the migration period of December to April, they are incredibly active and successful hunters. During our recent visit in January, we saw 2 cheetah hunts and a martial Eagle take a mongoose in front of our eyes!



One of the greatest safari experiences in Africa is a combination of Namiri Plains (in Eastern Serengeti) and Ndutu anytime from beginning December to end March.
